Unit Title/ Topic	<i>Unit 1: Emergence, consolidation and policies of Hitler. Causes, Practices and Effects of WW2 in Europe</i> (Authoritarian Leader and War in Europe)	Hours	41.25 Hours
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Mastering Content and Skills through INQUIRY (Establishing the purpose of the Unit): *What will students learn?*

Unit Description and texts

The topic explores the causes of wars, as well as the way in which warfare was conducted, including types of war, the use of technology, and the impact these factors had upon the outcome. Examination questions for this topic will require students to make reference to specific 20th-century wars in their responses, and may require students to make reference to examples of wars from two different regions of the world.
