Student Achievement:


On the Milestones assessment, we will increase the number of students who score a level four on Math and ELA by 15% and reduce the number of students who score a level two by 10%.


On the MAP assessment, we will increase the mean RIT growth score in reading and math for fourth and fifth graders from the Spring 2021 assessment to the Spring 2022 assessment.

In addition, we will continue to implement strategies to increase growth for 10% of our Free & Reduced Lunch (FRL) students.

Additional Components of the School Improvement Plan that Align to Student Achievement:

Human Resources:

- Provide professional support as needed throughout the year with staff development targeted to improve the learning environment for students, support instructional needs of teachers, and focus on using assessment to guide instruction;
- 2. Provide individual support and track progress of teachers who need to show more student growth of identified students;
- 3. Provide staff morale-building activities that recognize unique staff characteristics and personal growth needs/opportunities;
- 4. Organize and implement activities that are all-inclusive and structured around staff requests.

Communication & Collaboration:

- 1. Focus on collaborating with existing partners in education while adding partners that will support MCAA's school improvement plan and STE(A)M initiatives. The school will also work to increase volunteer opportunities through the PTSA and SGT;
- 2. Build positive relationships with identified parents through Coffee Talks and all parents through the implementation of Parent University: A monthly program that will provide important information about school programs and resources.
- 3. Hold teacher-student-parent conferences to ensure a shared responsibility for student growth.

Fiscal Responsibility:

- 1. Focus on using funds from Consolidated and Charter to supplement curriculum and instruction to support student achievement goals, STE(A)M initiatives, and innovative practices;
- 2. Communicate with transparency about fund usage and involve the school staff and SGT in funding decisions when appropriate;
- 3. Use PTSA and Foundation funds in a manner that impacts all students.
